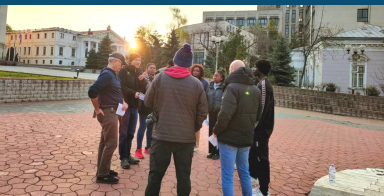
Serving in Romania

We have been so encouraged by what God is doing among the men at Bethany Baptist Church. The weekly Bible study has been well attended, and everyone is participating in the discussion. We just finished up the doctrine of conversion and have begun our study in Biblical Theology. After teaching one Saturday, I (Ken) was sharing with a young Egyptian man about our experiences in Romania as missionaries, from church-planting to equipping and even our conviction regarding the importance of good biblical doctrine to build healthy churches. By the end of that conversation, the Egyptian man asked to be baptized. May the Lord continue to grow each of these men in their understanding of the Gospel and in their passion for serving Christ in the local church.

The International Camp this year was the largest camp we've ever had – 50 people! A Muslim young man came who is from Bucharest. His name is Ekram. We are praying that he would not fear his family's reaction, but respond in faith to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

One visiting missionary recently said to us, "You and Monica have such a unique ministry: pastor, teacher, counselor, friend, dad, mom, grandpa, and grandma. God has really blessed you." We know that we, in and of ourselves, are not sufficient for these things, but we are grateful that Christ is our all-sufficient source of victory. For without Him we can do nothing.
