Why This Campaign Matters

FAQ

Are gifts tax-deductible?

What if I can only give a little?

Jesus praised the widow who gave two small coins (Mark 12:41-44). God calls for equal sacrifice, not equal gifts. Every gift matters when given in faith.

What if more is given than needed?

Extra funds will remain in a restricted account for future facility needs.

When will the project be fully funded?

We don't know the exact date—but our prayer is to become debt free as quickly as possible. We are trusting God "to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or imagine" (Ephesians 3:20).

When will the new Worship Center be completed?

Construction of the Worship Center is projected to be completed in November 2026.

What else can I do besides give?

Pray. Ask God to provide, to bless this project, and to use it for His glory in the Valley for generations to come.

Dear Trinity Family,

Each Sunday at Trinity is living proof that God is at work among us. The Worship Center, Discipleship Center, Upper Room, Jr. High Room, and High School Rooms are full. Classrooms are packed with little ones learning big Biblical truths they will one day grow into. What we once prayed for, God has already done. Jesus is being proclaimed.

Two and a half years ago, we stepped out in faith together, launching the Building Up, Living It Out vision. Through your prayers and sacrificial giving, God has already provided \$11.5 million and allowed us to break ground on this project and the parking lot is already laid.

This next step is not about comfort or prestige. It is about faithfulness. God's Word is being proclaimed. Disciples are being formed. Lives are being transformed. And our Trinity family keeps growing—so much so that our current space can no longer contain it. The new Worship Center is about making room for worship, fellowship, children and students, and for the generations that will follow long after you and I are gone.

The people of God in Nehemiah's day faced a different situation, but the same call. Nehemiah stood before them and said, "Come, let us build." And they responded, "Let us rise up and build." Their story reminds us that when God sets the work before His people, the right response is faith and obedience.

So it is with us. The growth is undeniable, and the need is clear. God has filled our current Worship Center, and now He calls us to rise up and build. We began this journey with the truth of Psalm 127:1—"Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain." That foundation of dependence still stands. But now, by His grace, we are living Nehemiah 2:18—rising up together to build what God has already begun.

This is not about equal gifts, but equal sacrifice. For one family, that may mean hundreds. For another, tens of thousands. What matters most is that each of us seeks the Lord and gives joyfully as He provides. As Paul reminds us, "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Our prayer is that years from now, our children, our grandchildren, and their children after them will look back and say about us: "They trusted God. They gave joyfully. They built a place where the Gospel was proclaimed and Christ was exalted."

Together, let us rise up and build—not for our name, but for our Father's glory, and for the generations yet to come.

SPACE FOR THE GOSPEL



Over 1,300 worshipers gather at Trinity each Sunday. Families fill the Worship Center, overflow into the Discipleship Center, and spread across three separate services.

Some hear the sermon live, others watch on video. We've tried to bridge the divide with announcements and creative workarounds, but it's just a band-aid. The result is fragmentation, not fellowship. We long to be one family, united in one room, worshipping together under the preaching of the Word of God.

But this is about more than us. It's about the thousands of people around us who have yet to know Christ.

The Fresno/Clovis area is home to nearly 1.2 million people, making it one of the fastest-growing regions in California. Yet fewer than four in ten residents regularly attend a Christ-centered church, and many have no knowledge of Jesus Christ at all. In other words, hundreds of thousands of men, women, and children in our own backyard are spiritually hungry and searching. They need a church that faithfully proclaims the Word of God, preaches the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and welcomes them into biblical community.

When they come to Trinity, we want them to find open doors. But right now, our space is maxed out. Visitors walk into a crowded lobby, get sent to overflow seating, and feel like there's no place for them in our church family. If we stay as we are, we risk turning people away, not intentionally, but practically.

This is why the new Worship Center matters. Not as a luxury or as a comfort, but as a calling. God has already brought the increase. Now He's calling us to make room for those He is still bringing. To delay is to say to our community: "There isn't space for you here." But to build is to say: "There's room for you at the table. Come hear the Word. Come meet Jesus."

The Valley is ready. The need is urgent. And the **time to build is now!**



THE VISION



Every element of our new building is designed with purpose:

- **1,000-seat Worship Center** with improved sightlines and acoustics so our whole church family can gather and engage together.
- **Light-filled, 3,200-sq-ft lobby** featuring large windows, warm materials, and plenty of seating to foster fellowship, welcome newcomers, and spark discipleship conversations.
- **Outdoor plaza and covered walkway** with landscaped paths, shaded benches,

and gathering nooks—offering space for connection before and after Worship Celebrations and room for community outreach.

- **Dedicated translation rooms** to make sure our Romanian, Russian, Ukrainian, Spanish, and other language groups can hear God's Word clearly.
- **Christ-centered design elements**, including a prominent cross integrated into the building and a clear visual axis that continually directs attention to the Gospel.
- **Fully accessible layout** with ramps and seating areas to ensure every age and ability can participate.

- **Modest Bookstore** filled with resources to equip the believer.
- **Flexible spaces** ready to host weddings, memorials, conferences, outreach events, and midweek discipleship.

This Worship Center isn't about comfort. It's about faithfulness. It creates a place where the Gospel can be preached without barriers, the church can be united in worship, and future generations will find room to meet Jesus and grow.

THE CURRENT REALITY AT TRINITY

- 3** Sunday services every week, just to fit everyone on campus.
- 3** Separate spaces used for worship—one live in the Worship Center, two simulcast in the Discipleship Center and the High School Room.
- 1,300+** Adult worshipers gathering in-person each Sunday.
- 350+** Children and students filling classrooms every week to learn God's Word.
- 400+** People worshiping online alongside us.
- 0** Chances for our whole church family to be together on campus at the same time on Sunday mornings.

THE LARGER NEED IN OUR COMMUNITY

- 1.2 million** Population of the Fresno metropolitan area.
- 63%** Fresno County residents with no connection to a Christian church.
- 5,500** Net new residents to Fresno in 2023—the county's largest one-year gain so far this decade.
- 5,000** New homes planned within a 1-mile radius of Trinity over the next five years.
- 14.8%** Job growth in Fresno from 2022 to 2023—one of the fastest in the state.
- 28.3%** Residents of Fresno County under the age of 18—a generation in need of truth, belonging, and spiritual foundation.

THE BOTTOM LINE FOR OUR CHURCH

Trinity has outgrown its walls.

We are fragmented across services, split between buildings, and stretched beyond capacity.

At the same time, the surrounding Fresno/Clovis area is growing rapidly—thousands of new families moving in, hundreds of thousands with no church home, and a generation rising that needs to hear the Gospel.

God is already bringing the people.

The question is this: will they find a seat, or will they find a church with no seat for them?

A HISTORY OF GRACE



The story of Trinity is a story of God's provision. From a handful of believers in a school cafeteria to a thriving congregation today, every milestone has been marked by His grace, His favor, and His faithfulness.

In 1991, a small group gathered at Lincoln Elementary School for the very first Trinity worship service. Just a few years later, God provided the 22-acre property on Willow Avenue that has become our church home. In 2003, after years of prayer and sacrifice, the current Worship and Children's Ministry Center was completed and dedicated on Palm Sunday.



As our church grew, so did the need for discipleship space. In 2019, God again provided through the generosity of His people, and the Discipleship Center was completed, creating new space for students, adult classes, and fellowship. By 2020, attendance had grown so rapidly that a third Sunday service was added, and the Discipleship Center became a much-needed overflow worship space.

A lot has changed since those first families met in a borrowed cafeteria. The buildings are bigger, the services more numerous, the ministries more wide-ranging. But one thing has not changed, and never will. Trinity remains committed to the faithful preaching of God's Word and to serving and worshiping the unchanging Most High God who was, and is, and is to come, "Declaring Jesus Christ, Caring for People." Through every season, God has been our anchor and our vision.



Again and again, God has been faithful. Again and again, the people of Trinity have responded in prayer, generosity, and sacrifice. Each building, each expansion, each step has been for one purpose, to proclaim the Gospel and love people. Now, as we stand at another turning point in our church's history, we look back with gratitude and forward with faith.

When Grace Found Us

We never planned to stay in Fresno. It was supposed to be temporary, a stop along the way. But in the middle of life's unpredictability, God had a different plan.

After a family tragedy that left us clinging to prayer, God used that heartbreak to draw us back to Him. For the first time in years, we found ourselves praying together, realizing how desperately we needed Christ at the center of our home.

When we visited Trinity, the teaching was clear, the worship was Christ-focused, and our hearts were stirred. We left that Sunday knowing this was where God wanted us.

Since then, He has been reshaping everything—our priorities, our marriage, our parenting, our hope. We are learning to pray as a family, to open the Word together, and to walk by faith instead of familiarity. **Trinity has become more than a place we attend. It has become the family through which God reminded us that grace does not just find you, it changes you forever.**

From Crisis to Candlelight

When our family first visited Trinity at the invitation of our closest friends, we left that Sunday certain we had found home. What we didn't know then was how deeply this church would one day hold us.

Months later, an unexpected woodworking accident changed everything in an instant. In the chaos that followed, the body of Christ surrounded us. Meals appeared on our porch. Prayers filled our phones. People from church we'd never met showed up at our door with tears, Scripture, and strength. In every need we hadn't yet voiced, God had already sent His people.

Through that season, **we learned that the Church is not just a place to worship—it's the family that carries you when you can't stand.**

Seven weeks later, on Christmas Eve, those still-bandaged hands trembled as we stood together to light the Christ advent candle. It wasn't about what we had lost, but about the light we had found. The same Savior who stepped into a dark world had stepped into ours—through the love of His people at Trinity.

I used to think God sent radiant angels when people were in need. Now I know He sends ordinary people, His servants who say, "Here am I. Send me."

When my husband passed away, every-thing around me went silent. I did not know what to do or who to call. But before I could even form a thought, a brother from Trinity showed up at my door faster than the paramedics. He stayed, he prayed, and he made sure we were cared for. In that moment, I saw the mercy of God in human form.

For years, I had struggled to connect in a new city, carrying loneliness and anxiety everywhere I went. But through that act of love, I realized I was not alone. **I now have a family, one knit together not by blood, but by the blood of Christ.**

God used His people to remind me that in His church, no one suffers unseen and no one grieves without hope.

Now, as we continue growing in God's Word, our family's faith has become living and active. The same love that once embraced us is now flowing through us as we learn to pour it onto others.

Where Faith Took Root


